Subject:- Grant of Yearly Permission to Belley Sankarpur Rajiv Gandhi Memorial Ayurvedic College & Hospital, Belley Sankarpur, P.O.-Kushdanga, P.S-Bhatpara, North 24, Parganas (N) 743126, West Bengal (Inst. ID:- AYU0263) with intake capacity of 50 seats (instead of 60 seats) in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2026-27 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 reg.

Sir/Madam,

- 1) To assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **Belley Sankarpur Rajiv Gandhi Memorial Ayurvedic College & Hospital, Belley Sankarpur, P.O.-Kushdanga, P.S-Bhatpara, North 24, Parganas (N) 743126, West Bengal (Inst. ID:- AYU0263)** inspection was conducted on **11.05.2026 and 12.05.2026 in hybrid mode** as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process for **issuance of permission with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2026-27 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020.**
- 2) The visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulations namely the Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and Attached Teaching Hospitals Regulations, 2024, provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder. **On careful examination of the assessment report and the shortcomings/defects were observed and same was placed in the 171th Board meeting of MARBSIM held on 13.08.2026 and Board decided to provide an opportunity of hearing to your college.**
- 3) In view of above an opportunity of virtual hearing vide the MARBISM letter (Hearing notice) of **even no. dated 17.08.2026** was granted to your college to appear on **20.08.2026** before the designated Hearing Committee to present their case and to show cause as to **why not the permission to your college with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2026-27, under section 28 of NCISM Act 2020 be denied.**
- 4) The college was directed to make written submission in respect of the case and produce all relevant valid documents/records/proof against all the deficiencies/shortcomings as indicated above. The representatives of the college submitted written submissions **vide letter. Ref. No. BSRGMACH/MED/208/2026 dated 18.08.2026** against the deficiencies conveyed to them. Whereas, the college through its representatives, **Principal of the college Dr. Tapas Kumar Mandal** appeared before the Hearing Committee on **20.08.2026** and made their submission virtually as well as written submission against the shortcomings communicated to the college.
- 5) Thereafter, observation of hearing committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report of the NCISM have been carefully examined in terms regulations, namely, "Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in the NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024, and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020, the observation of Hearing Committee was placed in the **174th Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) **held on 25.08.2026** and Board concluded that the **college not fulfilling the notified & requisite criteria for issuance of permission in UG (BAMS) and However, Board decided to issue permission as per the Punitive Policy for the Academic session 2026-27 and as per the Concerned Acts and regulations.**

❖ **As per the "Punitive Policy for the academic session 2026-27" :-**

- i) **"For each deficient teaching faculty, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 5% of total intake capacity."**

There is shortcoming of 1LF in the department of Ayurved Samhita & Siddhant and 1HF in the department of Shalaky Tantra and Shalya Tantra respectively.

There is deficiency of total 03 teaching faculties, therefore seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 15% of total intake capacity (i.e. Reduction of 09 seats).

- ii) **"For Deficiency in Non-Teaching staff (excluding group D staff) seat reduction in intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake capacity as under:-**

For non-availability of laboratory Technician seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 1 seat per 02 deficient staff.

As total 03 laboratory Technician are not available, Therefore seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 01 seats.

Therefore seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the 01 Seats of total intake capacity (i.e. Reduction of 01 seat)

Accordingly, after applying the seat reduction policy 2026-27 under section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020, college is fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of **yearly permission with intake capacity of 50 seats (instead of 60 seats) in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2026-27 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020.**

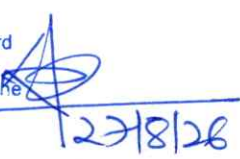
"DECISION"

- 6) **Yearly Permission is hereby granted to Belley Sankarpur Rajiv Gandhi Memorial Ayurvedic College & Hospital, Belley Sankarpur, P.O.-Kushdanga, P.S-Bhatpara, North 24, Pargnas (N) 743126, West Bengal (Inst. ID:- AYU0263) with (instead of 60 seats) in UG (BAMS) course in accordance with regulation 54 (3) of MESAR UG Ayurveda regulations, 2024 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020.**
- 7) Further, **as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020**, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then **in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.**
- 8) Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- 9) **Compliance report of all the requirements of Aadhaar Enabled Biometric Attendance System as mentioned in the implementation letters vide ref. no. 3/2024/MARB/AEBAS & HMS dated 09.05.2024 and 06.09.2024 issued by the board.**
- 10) **The following requirements must be fulfilled and the compliance report must reach the Board by 31st December, 2026 to be considered for the issuance of permission for the academic session 2027-28 :-**
 - i) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled.
 - ii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
 - iii) All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.
- 11) The fulfilment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college within the timeline as mentioned above to the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2027-28.
- 12) Further, in case you are not satisfied with the decision of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM, you may prefer an appeal addressed to the Chairman, NCISM, as per regulation 65(1) of MESAR 2024.

Note:- It is also noted that, if the concerned University does not grant affiliation to the college or withdraws the affiliation, the permission granted by MARBISM shall automatically stand withdrawn without any further notice or order.
